## Central Lutheran Church Council Minutes—December 15, 2009

### Members Present:

Jeff Franko, Michelle Rem, Sue Cooper, Larry Laber, Julie Palubicki, Bob Quinlan, Scott Olson, and Judy Davis

Sue led devotions and Larry led the discussion of Chapter 3 of Missional Renaissance by Reggie McNeal.

The secretary and treasurer's reports were accepted.

The treasurer's report indicates that expenditures for the current year exceed income by \$67,000. November's income was up and the council expects that the December income will also be higher than past months. The budget will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting on January 31<sup>st</sup>. There was extensive discussion on the proposed budget and the council members moved, with regrets, to pass this on to the congregation. The overall 2010 budget reflects a 9.4% overall decrease which includes a 5% cut in salaries.

Pastor Franko will be exchanging pulpits with Rev. David McBride on the weekend of January 23<sup>rd</sup>. This will commemorate full communion between the United Methodist Congregations and the ELCA.

Julie and Sue reported on the progress of the Acts 2:42 Study groups that will begin in January. Members of the congregation are encouraged to join to these groups.

Judy suggested that she would like to invite more congregational members in reading The Missional Renaissance.

### Pastor Franko's Report:

Since 9/9/09 THE FEAST has served meals to almost 2,100 people. Over 50 volunteers, providing a variety of gifts and passions, have made this ministry possible. Lutheran Campus Center has completed its quadrennial review by the ELCA. Some of the recommendations that came out of this timely review include the LCC Board's need to clarify the ministries vision and mission to WSU

and the other institutions of higher learning in Winona, pursuing a stronger relationship with Central Lutheran, and aggressively engage in a search process for another full time campus pastor. I, along with Mike Bernatz, serve on the LCC Board.

Pastors and staff reviewed the 2010 preliminary budget, upon the council's direction from our Nov. meeting, to bring the budget in line with expected income for the coming year – about a \$60,000 cut from the 2009 budget. To realize this target, significant cuts will be recommended in all program areas, including salaries to pastors and full-time staff.

It is comforting to note that the Christ Child came into the world when times were hard, life was a struggle, and the future looked bleak. So, too, the Christ Child comes into our world to bring us joy and peace and hope and love. May you find a special outpouring of these blessings this Christmas. Merry Christmas!

### Pastor Michelle Rem's Report:

Outreach and Communications – Advent and Christmas ads have been/will be placed in the newspaper. We found a sponsor for the radio broadcast of the St. Olaf Christmas Concert which will air December 24 at 9:00 & 11:30 am and December 25 at 4:30 pm on 101.1, 1380 and 1230 respectively. We continue to work on a new bulletin layout. Outreach has made significant cuts to the 2010 proposed budget.

**Pastor Olson's December Council Report:**

She presented a gift from our sister congregation, Immanuel Lutheran, Singida (a decorative gourd) and was presented with an overflowing basket of school supplies for the Kindergarten at Immanuel. The Hannah circle also provided supplies and a monetary gift. It was a blessing to see Jody personally and hear how God is working in, with and through her in Tanzania. With Pastors Franko and Rem, and Larry Finke, I attended the Living Liturgy Event Nov. 19-21 in Albert Lea. It was very worthwhile and we continue to discuss the ideas we gleaned.

In addition to the doing some mission and ministry interpretations via the flat screen TV and annual report, using excerpts from the Salt Talks. Stewardship will be recruiting new members and begin planning for the spring campaign. With Pastor Rem, Judy Manges and Judy Davis, I attended a free lecture by James Hunter on Servant Leadership through Viterbo's Ethics in Leadership Institute. Heukeshoven will be playing organ on those dates. The 10:30 service on the 27th will be led by Legacy. The spring 2010 choir schedule will be prepared soon.

**Jake Wagner's Youth and Family Report:**

Our Young Life partnership is off the ground and running. We officially have 20 spots for camp next summer at Castaway Camp in Detroit Lakes. Spots are filling up fast and I am hoping that we will be granted more spots if we have a waiting list by Feb 1. We will also have 3 other leaders other than myself on the trip and are looking into a joint ride with the Rochester Young Life that happens to be going to the camp during the same week. Each week the word is spreading about Young Life and the possibilities of evangelizing the person of Jesus are endless.

Good Earth Village will be the destination for many of our congregation's 3<sup>rd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> graders this summer. We have signed on as a church to come to GEV for a week of summer camp. As a member congregation we receive a 50 dollar discount per camper. How exciting it is to have such a great camp in our area. I remember going for 2 years as a kid and loved it – great memories! Our Sunday School program went off this past Sunday with great success. A special thanks to all the teachers, helpers, parents and friends that made this program possible this year. Our superintendents Pam and Tammy do such a wonderful job and we are blessed with the volunteer work that they do for our youth. I received many positive thoughts on the more traditional structure of the program.

There are still spots left for our mission trip to the Quad Cities for the middle schoolers this summer. I have seen many interested middle schoolers this year!

Several high schoolers and a Wednesday Night Workshop small group delivered roses to our congregation's members that are over 80 years old. What a blessing it was to have the youth be able to give a note of Christmas cheer.

**A WORD ABOUT THE 2010  
PROPOSED BUDGET**

At its December meeting the Church Council voted to present a 2010 budget to the congregation at the semi-annual meeting that reflects a 9.4% cut from our 2009 budget. In dollars and cents this means going from a budget of \$766,086 to one of \$700,796. These cuts will bring our spending more in line with our giving expectations. These cuts will take a toll on the things we will be able to do, our ability to maintain our property, and the way we compensate our pastors and staff.

Specifically, these are some of the things that will be affected:

- \*There will be no money in the budget to buy or replace any equipment for the church property, nor is there be anything budgeted for technology improvements.
- \*There will be no money in the budget for the ministries of Confirmation, Middle School Youth, Post Hi Youth, Camps & Retreats and conducting special events.
- \*Our ability to fund Worship and Music needs will be cut by 2/3<sup>rd</sup>s.

\*Our ability to fund Discipleship and Growth needs will be cut by 2/3<sup>rd</sup>s.

\*Support to the Synod will be cut by 11%, (from 9% to 8% of our general offering), and support to Lutheran Social Services, Emergency Assistance, Winona Volunteer Services, and Habitat For Humanity will be cut by 10%. Our support to Good Earth Village Bible Camp will be cut by 1/3<sup>rd</sup>.

\*Office Supplies will be cut by 20%.

\*The part-time Office Assistant position will be eliminated.

\*Clergy and full-time program and support staff will see a 5% cut in salaries.

We have some dedicated funds that we can use to help with some of these deficiencies and we will try to be creative in funding other needs. There will be several areas, however, that will simply suffer the effects of this situation.

Our semi-annual congregational meeting is scheduled for January 31, 2010 following the 11:30 service. Please make a point of attending this meeting as we work together to address the needs facing our congregation.
