# A Message from our Directing Pastor

as we adapted.






As families become more comfortable with returning to church, another new practice has emerged. At encouragement the church staff, congregation members have volunteered to lead children's sermons!



What's Happening at our Child Care Center? When you walk into Central, you may not realize, there is a lot happening behind the scenes!

### Children's experiences

The center teachers provide "studies" that offer depth of learning within subjects. There are many interesting studies that the children participate in; August studies are still summer exciting fun, with walks, discussions on bugs, learning about animals, the color gray and spending as much time outside as the weather permits. The older children ride bikes and run through the sprinkler. Summer foods are fun with ice cream making, picnics and s'mores.

### Contribution to the Winona Community

We currently are helping 55 families, 71 children enrolled. We work with families part time and full time to have the best experience possible at CLC CCC. We have a few families welcome little ones that we will be seeing in the future.

The Center employs 38 staff. This time of the year we have incoming new staff as we say good-bye or see you next fall to some of our employees that are students.

### A Message from the Lutheran Campus Center

A note from the Lutheran Campus Center:

This has been a summer for reconnecting. As I look back on the last month, or so, I realize how much I've met with, or talked with alums of the LCC. One of our beloved 2020 graduates met with me for coffee on the Sunday before her move to the Twin Cities. We found ourselves in conversation about life, spirituality, empathic people, and hope. I was thrilled to hear of her new job, her new house and housemates, and all her dreams as she set out on a new chapter in her life. A week later, I saw her mom at an event at Kinstone, and we both gushed at how proud we were of her. It was a reminder for me at how much of an impact a community like the LCC can have— not just for students, but for their relationships with family members, friends, and the communities in which they find themselves after graduation.

A couple weeks later, another graduate popped in to update me on her new job offer at a school. We recalled her growth over the past four years and the ways in which she will watch out for her students, advocate for them, and show them Love.

- That same week, another student texted me out of the blue. He, too, had just landed a dream job and graduated. And, finally, a 2021 graduate met me for coffee just a few days ago. She is still looking for a job, but in the meantime, is helping kids through a summer program in her community.
  - This is a little embarrassing, but I felt like a proud mother after these conversations. Now, I am clear with my students about being their pastor and not another parent, but there's something very close to a motherly kind of pride and awe when I hear what they're doing in the world beyond college. A couple students I had the honor of marrying four summers ago are setting out on an IVF journey, sharing their stories publicly in order to encourage others. Another one is moving to Portland, and still another called recently to talk about the impact of the LCC's acceptance and grace in his life as he became who he is.

You know what's coming next, right? My gratitude...but I really mean it. Thank you, dear Central Lutheran Church, for your part in these students' lives and beyond. You have impacted whole communities, families, future students, and even babies coming into the world through your generosity and presence with campus ministry. Do you know what I mean, then, about feeling like proud? Thanks be to God for you and for these dear students.

There are already a couple of refugee families in Winona whom other churches / organizations in town have sponsored. I have been in conversation with Pr. Katie from Faith Lutheran and Pr. Jeff from Cedar Valley Lutheran about making this a joint venture. Taking on this mission will require a long-term commitment to the family as they get orientated into a new culture, a new town and school, and a new way of life. This mission will also need resources (money and household items) to assist the family as they get settled. I am looking for 3 to 5 members to be a part of the committee to work to make this sponsorship happen. There is an organizational meeting scheduled for **Thursday, Aug. 5**<sup>th</sup> @ **6:30pm at Faith Lutheran Church**. Please talk with Pr. Michael if you are interested in becoming a part of this group to help welcome a new family into our community.

Habitat for Humanity serving Winona County is thrilled to partner with the Skappel family on our next home build! This family was selected two years ago and has had to patiently wait while the building process was delayed due to COVID safety regulations.

Habitat homebuyers are required to put in 325 hours of sweat equity. While Melissa waited for construction to begin on her home, she volunteered over 100 hours working in our ReStore!

Now that construction has begun, Melissa, Melissa's parents, and Tony can often be found on the construction site working right alongside volunteers.

As we work to construct this home, we also work to help prepare the family. Habitat homebuyers are required to attend classes such as Home Maintenance, Fire Prevention, Feeding Your Family on a Budget, and Finance 101.

Once construction is complete, Habitat will sell the house to the family with an interest-free loan. Habitat homes are not free. Once the home is paid off, it will be a permanent asset to the family for generations.

Due to the current fluctuation in cost of many building supplies, Habitat still has \$15,000 left to raise to complete this build. Will you consider partnering with us as we work with Skappels to build themselves a better future?

At Habitat for Humanity, this is what unites us. Through shelter, we empower.



# Council Report: June 8, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Jeremy opened with devotions.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

Paul gave the following report:

General Offering Income was \$36,040 compared to the budget of \$37,955. YTD giving was \$169,073 exceeding the budget of \$157,814.

Expenses were \$42,332 compared to the budget of \$45,803. YTD expenses of \$231,220 compared to the budget of \$232,115. Bottom line (2,894) compared to the budget loss of (4,051) YTD bottom line was (\$40,279) compared to the budget of (\$56,101).

Child Care incurred a small loss of (\$1,071) in May. YTD (\$6,172)due to the impact of COVID. Grant of \$5,500 received in May.

Tammy moved, Merna 2nd, Carried to approve the Treasurer's Report.


