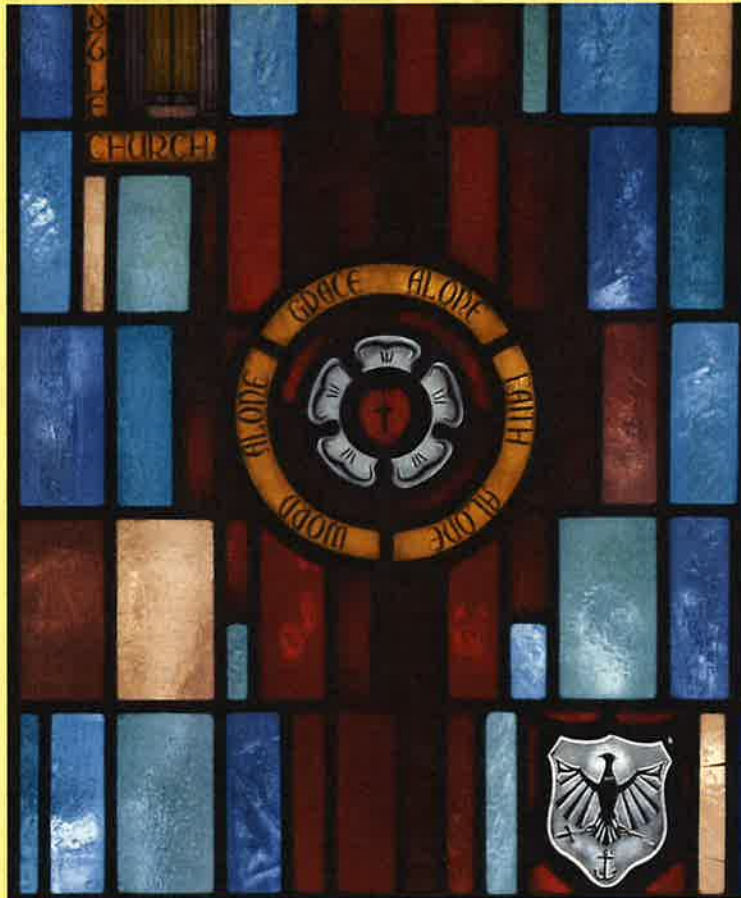

## ***A Message from our Worship, Music & Arts Director***

*Worship.* What does worship mean to you? The Merriam-Webster dictionary defines the word as both a verb and a noun. As a verb, "1. to honor or show reverence for as a divine being or supernatural power, 2: to regard with great or extravagant respect, honor, or devotion." I think that we can all agree that worship requires some form of action on our part whether it is demonstrated through singing, praying, meditating, serving, or simply being still. Personally, I often define it as connecting or attempting to connect to God. As Director of Worship, I view my role as a facilitator of worship.

We all have expectations when we come to worship (noun) services. Some find it easy to worship to the mighty swell of the organ. Others feel more comfortable with piano and guitar. Our unique preferences are demonstrations of our multifaceted God in whose image we are made.

For November & December, Central Lutheran Church will offer a variety of worship services in order to facilitate worship for a broader spectrum of people.

### **8:00 AM Traditional Service**

The music for this service will be predominantly organ-led. It will contain more of the traditional liturgy. Essentially, it is the service that Central Lutheran currently offers.

### **10:15 AM Modern Service**

The music at this service will be led by piano and guitar (additional musicians, if available). It will follow the customary outline of worship: Gathering, Word, Meal, Sending. However, it will contain fewer formalities. Worship leaders will not wear vestments and we will use a contemporary liturgy. Music and liturgy will be scripturally based, have relevance to the readings and theme of the season/day, and must align with ELCA doctrine. I have heard from many of you that Central Lutheran offered similar services in the past and that you are open to holding them once again.

In early December, we will hold a Worship Forum. We want to hear from you. This forum will help us determine how to shape worship services for the remainder of the winter and spring. The date and time of the forum will be announced in the November newsletter.

As stated in our mission statement, as a church body, we strive to connect with God and each other. The variety in worship services is a practical way that we can facilitate meaningful worship and reach our neighbors.

Ninth grade Confirmation classes have also begun, as our confirmands prepare to affirm their baptism and become full members of our congregation. The Night of Honor will occur on October 28th at 6:30 PM for the confirmands and their families (reservations required), and the Confirmation Sunday service will be October 31st at 10:15 AM in the sanctuary (no reservations required). A livestream will be provided, so extended family and friends can watch from home if they choose.

Pastor Short and I are excited to offer two fun summer adventures in 2022: one is a trip to the National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis on July 24-28, which is open to students currently in grades 8-12; and one is a mission trip (destination and date TBD) for students currently in grades 7-12. 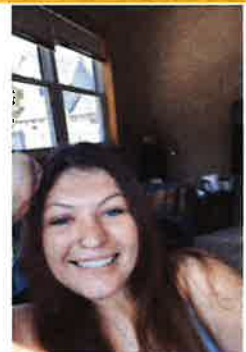
## Ministry Milestones

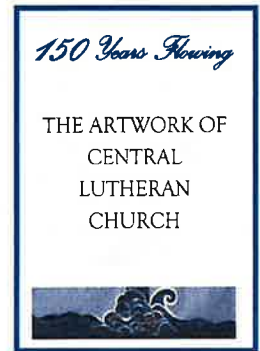
