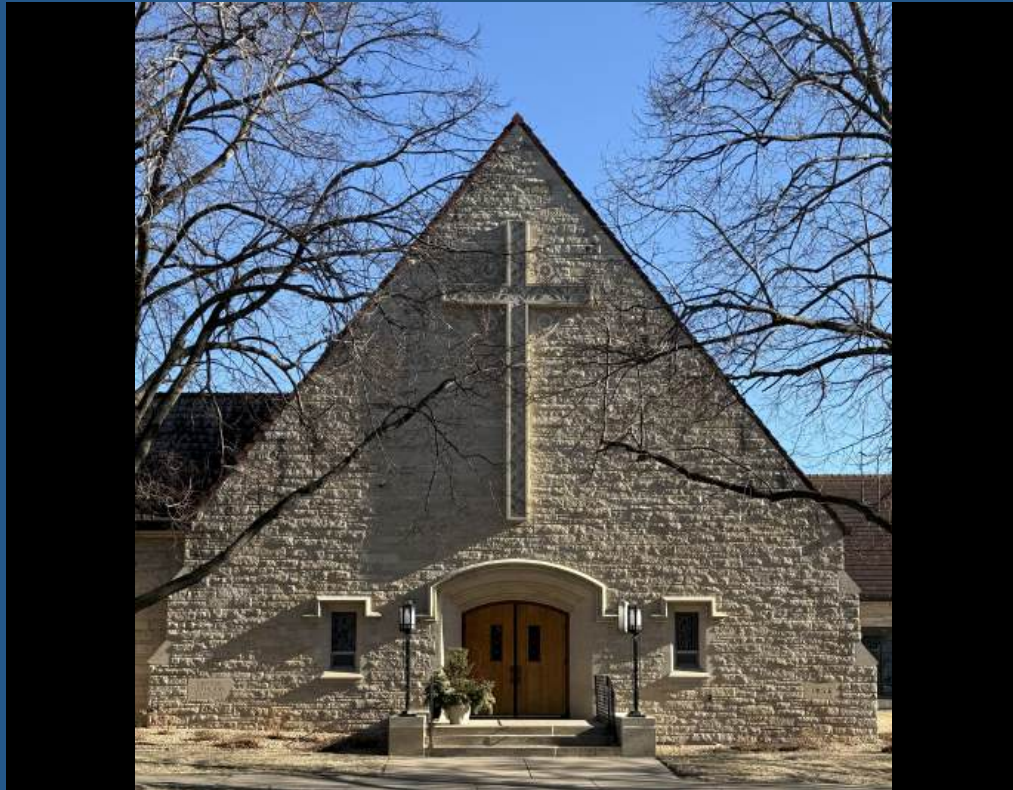

# A MESSAGE FROM OUR DIRECTING PASTOR

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

A new month brings a new season. On Ash Wednesday, March 5<sup>th</sup>, we usher in the season of Lent. For many people they see the season of Lent as a season of reflection, a time of contemplation. I find that is often true in my life as well. Maybe it is because of the changing of the season in the outside world, moving from the cold melancholy days of winter towards the hopeful signs of spring. Whatever the reason, change offers us time to reflect not only on the past but to contemplate what the future might hold.

In the church the season of Lent was often a time of preparation. For Christians it has been a time of contemplation on the life of Jesus our Savior, on his suffering and his death and what that means for us as we seek to live as followers of Christ. It has traditionally been a time of catechisms, that is questioning and of learning about the faith, especially for those new to the faith preparing for baptism. The tradition in the ancient church, new converts to the faith were often baptized on Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil in preparation for becoming a member of the church on Easter morning.

In light of that traditional practice, during the season of Lent here at Central we will be reflecting on our own baptism and contemplating the promises made at the time. In our current practice when a child is brought to the font questions are asked of the parents and sponsors. These questions are again asked when a young person is confirmed during their affirmation of baptism. We will look at each of those questions during our Lenten services at 6:pm on Wednesday night and during our Adult Education time on Sunday mornings. As such during this season of Lent you are invited to join us on Sunday morning or Wednesday evening as you reflect upon and contemplate the promises made at your own baptism. [Additional information can be found in the newsletter as to days and times of the services]

I also want to take time to say thank you to all of you who participated in our annual meeting back on Feb 9<sup>th</sup>. It excited me because events like annual church meetings are often not well attended as they are seen as boring or unexciting, yet we had a greater turnout of people than we have had in years. This excited me because as I said in the meeting, the ministry of Central cannot happen without you. As I gathered information for the annual report, I was able to get from the committees and volunteer leaders that you, the members of Central, gave more than 10,000 volunteer hours last year. That is a lot of hours offered by a number of members. This also indicates the health and the vitality of the ministry taking place here at Central. So I give thanks to God for each of you who gave of your time and energy in the past year and who continue to do so now and into the future.

I continue to be excited about what is coming in the new year. We continue to plan for a future, a vibrant community seeking to live out their baptismal calling. It is from here where we gather in the name of our Savior that we are sent to proclaim the Good News of Jesus through word and deed, serving all people following the example of Jesus, as we strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

# A MESSAGE FROM OUR ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When Christmas season had finished in January, and Pastor Short and I were planning out spring with worship and events, lent felt like a million miles away. Now, Ash Wednesday draws close and invites us to enter into the season of lent. With the season of Epiphany passing by in a whirlwind, and February disappearing as fast as the weather changes, I have recently felt like I am sometimes gasping for a breath of air. In this world of fast-paced days and anticipation of spring to come, I yearn for a chance to reflect , a chance for quiet, and a change to strengthen my footing in life through faith.

The great news for all of us that may feel that way, even if slightly, is that this upcoming season of lent is a chance to do all of those things. In this Lenten season, we are invited and encouraged to practice spiritual disciplines, to reflect on our relationship with God and find connection. We are encouraged to take that breath, or gasp, of fresh air. I know for some of us, including myself as a working parent, that the thought of doing one more thing can be overwhelming. But I truly believe that spending even just a little bit of extra time focusing on reflection and connection in our faith life can harvest a sense of peace and calm for days after.

Lent is a season of reflection but it's also a season of intention. When we are intentional about our spiritual disciplines, our connections, our reflections, we will receive far more than we think.

So, this season of lent, we invite you to be intentional about your faith. Be intentional with your relationships with God, be intentional in spiritual practices, be intentional and give yourself grace. Intent doesn't have to be reading 25 pages of the Bible every day. It can simply be, making sure to take a 5-minute break and reflect on the ways you have seen God at work in your life. It could be a quick prayer on the way to work, or picking up a lenten devotional to use from church (available at service on March 2). Intent could be committing to coming to our weekly Wednesday night Lenten service. Maybe your intent for Lent is simply looking and recognizing how God works in our lives. Whatever your intent is for the season, lean into it and give yourself grace when things don't go perfectly.

Intent doesn't mean perfection, it means progress.

Our first concert for 2025 will be by *Flauto Dolce*, made up of Stacie Lightner (organ) and Donna Hryniewicki (flute). The duo performs a wide range of music to as broad an audience as possible. On Sunday March 23 at 2 p.m. this Twin Cities based duo will present a concert of music by Emma Lou Diemer, Aaron Copland, Gustav Jensen, and more. Admission is free and all are welcome to attend. A freewill offering will be collected to differ the duo’s travel expenses.

Sister Stacie Lightner grew up on a farm outside Garden City, Kansas. She started piano lessons when she was five years old, and organ lessons when she was eighteen. She earned bachelor’s degrees in organ performance and religious studies from The University of Kansas and then spent a year studying organ in Germany on a Fulbright Scholarship. She returned to KU to pursue a master’s degree in church music, followed by a Doctor of Music in organ performance at McGill University in Montreal. During her doctoral studies she developed a passion for hymnody and liturgy while simultaneously serving as the chapel organist at a Presbyterian seminary and singing in an Anglo-Catholic church choir that specialized in chant and Renaissance polyphony. She then returned to the Midwest, where she served in several churches in Nebraska. In March 2018, Sister Stacie was consecrated a Deacon in the ELCA. She is a member of the Deaconess Community of the ELCA and therefore uses the title “Sister.” She is currently Cantor at St. Paul- Reformation Lutheran Church in St. Paul.

Flutist Donna Hryniewicki works as an Instructional Designer in the Twin Cities where she also maintains a busy private music studio teaching flute, clarinet, saxophone, and piano. Donna is familiar with Winona. Her master’s degree is from Saint Mary’s University of MN. Donna earned a Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) from the University of Minnesota (Twin Cities) and is an active regional performer.

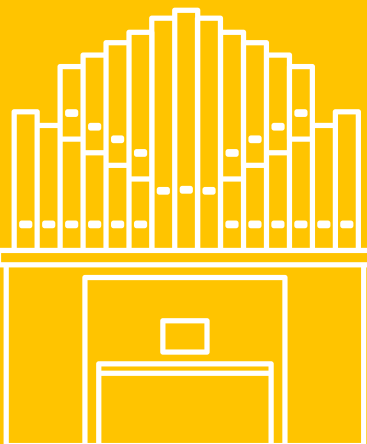

Judy Davis attended Project Fine's annual meeting on February 13th at St. Mary's College. Thank you to the whole crew of volunteers that shopped, and cooked the chili, cornbread, and desserts for the Chili Lunch Fundraiser. ## Cranes of Peace



in 1955, 12 year old Sadako Sasaki was diagnosed with leukemia due to radiation poisoning from the atomic bomb dropped at Hiroshima in 1945. Inspired by Japanese folklore, the young girl started folding cranes. Legend said that if 1,000 paper cranes were folded you would be granted one wish. Sadako folded over 100 cranes praying for a world without war or nuclear weapons. She died that year without her wish being realized. Today children all over the world fold paper cranes as a symbol of peace and a continued hope for a world without war. On January 26th, the 5th and 6th grade Sunday School class folded origami cranes as a tribute to Sadako Sasaki. They too, wish for a world without war and nuclear weapons.
