A MESSAGE FROM OUR DIRECTING PASTOR

Sisters and Brothers

He has Risen. He has risen indeed! These were the words which marked for us the fulfillment of the promise that while our Jesus died on the cross and was buried, death did not have the final say. Now we enter into the season of Eastertide, the season of Easter where we hear the accounts of the impossible; of the disciples' encounters with the risen Messiah. As we hear these stories we connect because the disciples are asking the questions we might have asked if we were there and may still be asking.

Here in this season of Easter we will ponder many of those questions and answers. Can we believe having not seen the nail holes in the hands of Jesus? Do we doubt the reality that someone has or can be raised from the dead? We will wonder at the miracle catch of fish reminding the disciples of their first encounter with Jesus by the sea shore. We will also spend time hearing of those first believers reading through the Book of Acts. There are many questions with few answers. Yet the one thing we can do is follow the example of the disciples and those of the early church moved by the Spirit to fulfill Christ's mission to go and make disciples of all nations.

Following the examples of the disciples as well as our forefathers and mothers continues to be part of the mission we all share. Here at Central we have talked for the last year about a big upcoming project. Our beautiful organ needs updating, a process which will start in early 2027. As we prepare for the renewing of our organ for the next 30+ years, the same may be said about our sanctuary. I have been talking with some of you about what changes you would like to see about which things we may want to update to keep our sanctuary viable for the next 30+ years of its life.

As a result we are gathering information about the costs for new flooring (including removing the old tiles with asbestos), new paint, and new pew cushions among some of the items. Some members have made suggestions about other aspects within the sanctuary in order to keep the sanctuary a welcoming place for all who enter. One of those suggestions was new entry doors from the parking lot into the sanctuary to allow more natural light to enter the space. These are some of the most mentioned items, but there may be others you are thinking about.

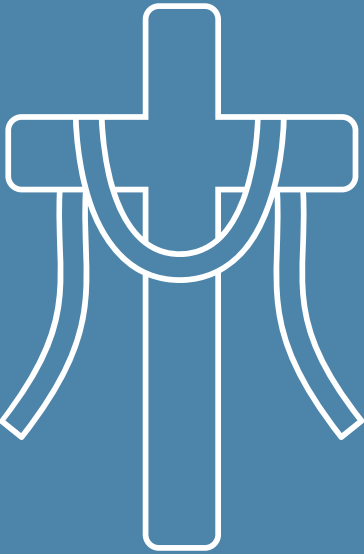
As such you are invited to a couple of listening sessions between services on May 11th and 18th. At those listening sessions we will share the ideas we have already received and as we are able share a rough estimate of costs. Also to hear any additional suggestions and get your input on setting the priorities as we move forward.

I know this is a long term project, one which will need to be sustained over the next couple of years as we wait for the organ company to begin their work. At the same time, it offers us the opportunity to gather the resources and determine the best way forward as we seek to fulfill our mission to serve others in the name of Jesus our Risen Lord and Savior.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

By the time this newsletter reaches you, most students will have about a month left of school. There will be countdowns to June and thoughts of warm summer days filled with trips to the pool, running around the neighborhood and sleeping in. As the school year sets on the horizon, I can't help but reflect back on all the amazing things that have happened with our students this school year, while also looking forward to what summer holds for our students at church.

This year at Central, 7th and 8th graders have worked hard during confirmation to live out their faith. They've caroled at local senior living facilities, put on an entire Easter scavenger hunt, made Valentine's cookies and Christmas bags and showed up again and again to serve during Sunday morning worship. They have dug deep and reflected on their own faith life and how they live it out. We've asked hard questions and leaned into a loving God. Together, the confirmation class has truly lived out their faith by connecting, serving, and growing with each other.

In Sunday school, students have been nurtured in their faith upbringing by a group of amazing volunteers who have given their time, energy and love week after week. They have crafted, played games, learned about the Bible and experienced the love of God and the love of their church. The 5th and 6th graders veered from their "normal curriculum" and have taken on an approach that includes agency, connection, and lived-out faith experiences. Because of that, those students have shown up again and again on Sunday morning, excited to be together in community, learning about faith together.

But wait, there's more! We confirmed sixteen 9th graders at the end of October, had high school volunteers leading the PK Sunday school room, have currently 16 Central students signed up to go on a week-long mission trip in July and have had numerous fundraisers where the church has shown up for our students for that trip. Pastor Short, Eric, and I have had a ball with our childcare chapel on Thursday mornings, singing and dancing.

All these amazing things that have happened this year have been the tip of the iceberg. There's been so many great things happening this year, and that is an understatement. So much has transpired because of our volunteers, leaders and church. Children, Youth and Family ministry is alive and well at this church thanks to this wonderful community. Thank you for your time, your love, energy, treasures, well wishes, donations, and most importantly, showing up. Kids from ages 0-18 (and on!) need a community that is behind them, loving them and nurturing them in faith. Thank you for being that for our children.

While the school year draws to an end, we look forward to all of the great things- VBS, mission trips and summer camps, on the horizon!

THANKFULNESS

May Day (May 1st) is traditionally celebrated around the world as "International Workers Day". In Germany, where my father grew up, people celebrate by dancing around the "Maibaum" or maypole wrapping it in colorful streamers.

My May Day came in 2022 when I accepted the position of Director of Worship, Music & Arts at Central. It is a day that I will never forget. As I was anticipating completing my 35-year teaching career at Saint Mary's University and easing into retirement the school announced it was eliminating all Arts-related majors. A devastating blow on multiple levels.

I have been privileged to work as a "supply" organist for many area churches since moving to Winona in 1984. I recall being a long-term sub at Central on several occasions. When Aleah Harvey announced she was moving on in January 2022, I happily agreed to fill in once again.

The date of Easter that year was similar to this year April 17th. Pastor Short and I had a meeting scheduled in early April to discuss music for Holy Week. During that meeting I asked Pastor Short how the worship director search was coming. He was not terribly optimistic and said that those who had applied either wanted a part-time position or were not in the area and, probably, were just fishing. I asked if it was too late to throw my hat in the ring and, well, you know the answer.

Later that afternoon, I was looking up an unfamiliar hymn in the "All Creation Sings" collection. As so often happens, I turned to a different page than the one I was seeking. The page I opened was hymn 1004 – "Faith Begins by Letting Go".

Faith begins by letting go,
giving up what had seemed sure,
taking risks and pressing on,
though the way feels less secure:
pilgrimage both right and odd,
trusting all our life to God.

And here I am, beginning my fourth year at Central praising God through music with all of you.

It continues to be my honor, privilege, and joy to serve this amazing congregation.

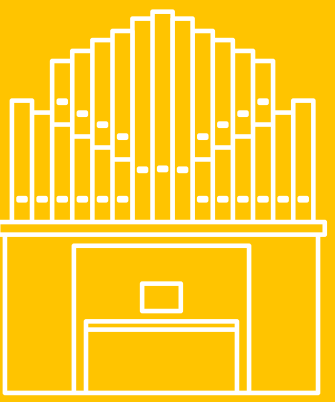
