A Message from our Directing Pastor

From the time Jesus started his ministry on earth, proclaiming the Kingdom of Heaven has come near he called and invited the apostles to come and follow him. As Jesus shared the love of God with others and the number of followers kept growing so was the need for additional servants of God. Even after Jesus death, resurrection and ascension the remaining apostles needed others to join them as the numbers of believer continued to grow. In the sixth chapter of Acts they appointed seven more disciples so that all might be served and cared for as Jesus instructed.

At our annual meeting last February, we approved the process of calling a second pastor to Central in order that we might continue to serve our growing community of believers. That process continues and hopefully in August we can introduce to you a candidate for you to call to that position. The addition of an Associate Pastor here at Central will help us as a congregation to better serve each of you, in particular the youth and young families of Central. Yet the Associate Pastor will not be able to do so alone. We will still need the active support and participation from you.

In church language this is referred to as stewardship. While some shy away from using this term it is foundational to who we are as people of faith. Being a steward, is one who has been given gifts and resources for to grow the Kingdom on earth and to share the love of God with those in need. Stewardship is the use of those resources, both in time and energy as well as financial for the growing of the Kingdom of God.

So in the coming months Central will be asking for your help. The first will be as we seek to be sure our directory and contact information is accurate. In early August along with your statement of giving, you will be sent a request to update your contact information for each member of your household. Especially in these days as home land lines are being cut in favor of cell phones, many phone numbers are no longer working. In addition, we need to be sure we have updated emails as we continue to send more and more information electronically.

Later in the fall we will sent out a Time and Talent form so you can indicate how you might be willing to support the ministries of Central with your time and energy. This could be offering to assist in worship as an usher or communion assistant. Behind the scenes activities helping with the altar guild or sitting in the balcony running the video equipment or helping Bob with sound. Maybe your gift is musical and you can join the choir or play an instrument. Maybe your gifts are teaching and caring for youth by working with our Sunday School or Confirmation programs. There are as many needs within the church as talents and gifts you have to share.

This fall will also bring a financial stewardship program. As the church continues to grow so does the need to insure the church has the resources to serve those needs in the community. At that time, we will lay out our vision for the mission and ministry of Central so you know what it will take to do accomplish all these things.

Writing to the church in Corinth (1 Corinthians 12), Paul reminds them and us that while we each have our own ability, all parts are needed in order for the whole body of Christ to function. There are so many good things happening and growing here at Central so I invite you to consider how you can join us in this mission.

Blessings to you as we enjoy these final days of summer as we begin this new chapter in the ministry of Central.

The Arts at Central





Council Report: May 9, 2023

Steve called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Kati opened with devotions. Jeremy will have devotions in July.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Tim moved, Kati seconded, carried to approve the agenda.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mark moved, Steve seconded, carried to approve the April 11, 2023, minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mark presented the following financial report:

April 2023 Financial Report

April income was 16.5% higher than last year, but we spent 13.9% more than we brought in for the month. Both income and expenses were lower than budget. April income was \$37,492 and short of budget of \$43,345 by (\$5,853). Income of \$37,492 less the monthly expenses of \$42,709 gave the month a loss of (\$5,217). The expenses were also under budget of \$51,307 by (\$8,598).

YTD expenses are \$36,106 under budget at \$172,022 compared to budgeted expenses of \$208,128.

The YTD Total Income of \$181,298 less the YTD Expenses of \$172,022 gives 2023 a gain of \$9,276. We are keeping ahead of expenses because of the ERC grant, but we are chipping away at that lead.

In April, extra expenses were \$3,351.36 for the electrical bill and \$321.86 for new light bulbs.

The Child Care Fund had income of \$67,455 less expenses of \$62,105 giving it a monthly gain of \$5,350. The YTD gain is \$39,497 and the Fund Balance is \$118,968, which is the sum of all gains and losses over time.

Following discussion, Kati moved, Myrna seconded, carried to approve the financial report.
