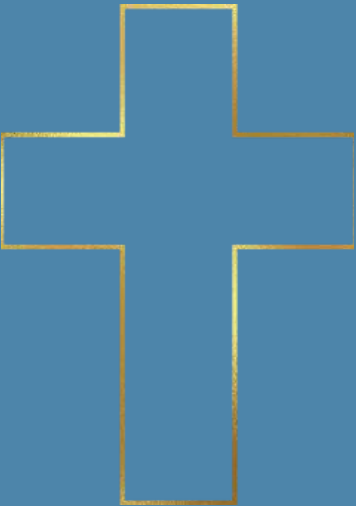

A MESSAGE FROM OUR ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters of Christ,

January brings about new changes for all of us with the start of a new calendar year. The days start to once again get a little longer, the holidays are over, and we find ourselves hunkering down a little for the bitter cold of winter. Amid all of that, many of us find ourselves wrestling, some determined and some not, with new year's resolutions. Many people find challenge and joy in starting off their new year optimistically different, working to make their lives better. And, I say good for them!

I am not a person to make resolutions, not because I don't believe in them, but I'm always in the mindset of why not start today, why not make changes as soon as we feel motivated. When we think about this in terms of our faith life, I often think about what God is calling us to right now. Not just in our individual lives, but also collectively as Christians.

We can find inspiration for this all over the Bible, stories of people who follow the call of God. Moses leading the Israelites out of Egypt, Deborah leading the Israelites to battle with the Canaanites, Mary carrying and giving birth to the Son of God. Yet, when I think about how God calls us, I often think of Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus was a short, chief tax collector who found wealth by taking his share of taxes from the people of Jericho. Yet, Jesus called him to a different life, and he immediately surrendered by giving away half his possessions and paying back anything that was stolen, four times over.

What strikes me about this story that has stayed with me is the immediacy of how Zacchaeus responds to Jesus. This tax collector doesn't hum and haw over what Jesus calls him to, he just does it and does it eagerly. Zacchaeus has a servant's heart that is reflected in his immediate actions. One of the things that I love about Central is how I get to see this same type of servant heart in many of our community. We often have the chance at Central to show up and live out our immediate calling to be a church of love and grace; a place that shares God's love with our neighbor and welcomes all.

Jesus calls us to respond to the overflow of love and grace that comes from God with our own overflow of love and grace onto others. This call is for not for tomorrow, or three months down the road, but for today, for now. This year as we think about the things in our lives that we'd like to change, or do more of this year, I pray that we all feel the call of love and grace for others. I pray that we can all live out our immediate calling with whatever time, talent or treasures that we have.

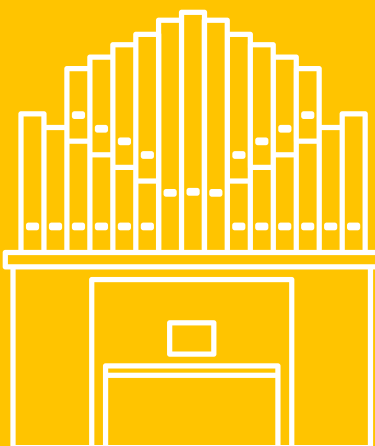
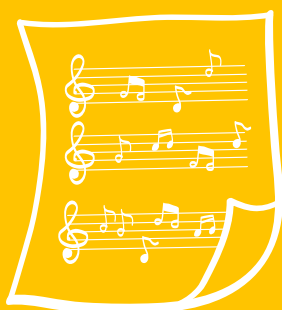

They were spread out around the room, so I invited each one individually to have some dinner and join us, or keep studying. It turned out they were there together, so after they filled bowls with homemade chicken noodle soup and vegetable noodle soup (perfect for this time of year with all the sickness going around campus!), they sat at a table together and ate. One student wore a hijab. I mention that only because it warms my heart that students who come from different faith background also receive nourishment and welcome from the LCC- without hesitation. At the end of the evening Susan Zeller brought nursing students in to also get some food. Though we miss our space on Huff Street, we are mindful of the opportunity we have to share the spirit of LCC with those who otherwise may never have come through our doors on Sunday night.

Our worship the last Sunday of the semester includes the four weeks of Advent *and* Christmas Eve. This year we heard Scripture readings for the season alongside poems by Maya Angelou, including "Amazing Peace". One line of this beautiful poem felt especially illustrative of our evening on the terrace, sharing our food and the love of God with all:


