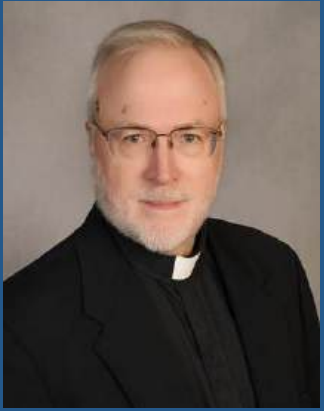

As I write this, the Welcome and Worship Committee is changing colors in our sanctuary again. Taking down the banners of Easter gold, changing out altar cloths and ceiling banners in various parts of our sanctuary to have red as it's accent color. This day that I write, it is the week of Pentecost and the ending of the season of Easter in Church. The red signifying the flame of the Holy Spirit that we will talk about and celebrate on Pentecost. Then, the following week will be Holy Trinity Sunday where we celebrate just that- the unity of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Welcome and Worship will be here yet again to change the colors in the Sanctuary back to white- for the glory of God, for the purity of the trinity. Both of these days, Pentecost and Holy Trinity, are days where we might look towards the mystery of God and lean into our faith as we may wrestle with the mysteries of it all. After all of this, we head into our "ordinary times", that is the time of the church year where we simply are. There are no big church holidays, and instead we look inwardly towards our growth that comes from everyday faithfulness. The color? Green of course. Green signifying the growth, like the growth of trees.

For some of us, ordinary seems, well, ordinary. Plain, uneventful, mediocre almost. But, really it's just the routine, the expected. We live our life, we wake up, make the coffee, do the dishes, take out the trash, mow the lawn, etc. Much of our lives are like this, day by day, week by week our lives look the same. The ordinary does not diminish the sacredness of caring for and stewarding things God has called us to. In the book "Every Moment Holy" by Andrew Peterson, he reminds us that "there are no unsacred moments; there are only sacred moments and moments we forgot are sacred".

Ordinary times in church is anything but ordinary. It's a chance to remember the miracles of God working in our everyday life, it's a time of the discipline of growth. As Danielle Hitchen says in her book "Sacred Seasons", the green season is "a time to dig our roots a little deeper, grow taller, stand firmer in the life of Christ." The year of the church, the church seasons aren't just for show, but are there so that we may live more deeply into the life of Christ and understand how the Holy Spirit works in all seasons of the year.

As we enter this Ordinary Time that is anything but ordinary, I encourage you to prayerfully listen to what God is calling you into about yourself and your spiritual needs. Listen to the Holy Spirit and let her be your energizer and catalyst for growth. If you need help with what that looks like in faith, Pastor Short and I invite you to sit down and chat with us. We are here for you. Then, in late summer, keep your eyes on the lookout in the sanctuary. The colors will change from a green to a darker green, signifying the deep growth that we have accomplished together in this season of faithfulness.

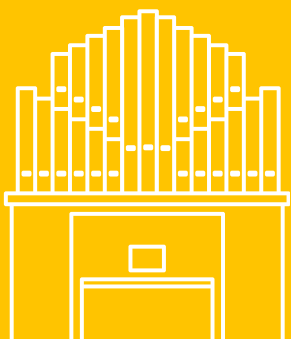
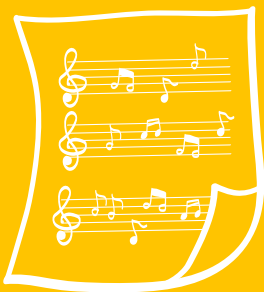

Dear church, you have given us such a gift. The LCC was having a pretty great year even before we moved into the brick house in the corner of your parking lot, but I witnessed the LCC community deepen and expand in such beautiful ways since. Let me back up...

Last spring (2025) during Final Exams week, I brought a wagon full of breakfast foods to the little courtyard outside Krueger Library on WSU's campus. I set up a table, a marker board indicating that people could take what they'd like, and spread a blanket out for my little one who was "helping Mom." Students who had come to dinner, worship, or other events like Bible Study throughout the year stopped by to get food. They stayed a while, talking with Sadie, me, one another, and passersby. As one student started to leave, she remarked, "It was really nice talking with you guys and actually getting to know you!" While it was a nice thing to hear the students say to one another, it was also shocking to me. After all, the LCC students are usually a close-knit community, even for those who aren't able to come often. I understood that the fire had an even bigger impact than people may realize— that the very essence of who we are as a campus ministry shifted without our gathering space.

A student from Saint Mary's who had been part of the LCC her first two years wrote this: "Right after the fire, Corrine preached that it wasn't about the building, but about the people in the building and the connections we share. But I've begun to think that this is not entirely true. The building was an integral part of the connection. It was where our community gathered. It was a member in our community."

Back to this year... having a space we decorated and made "our own" in Grace Hall for the first semester was more welcoming for newcomers. But, the real magic happened when we moved into the house and really had a space of our own. Students began inviting more friends for movie nights, dinners, worship, and Bible study. One Friday, a group got together and made a pasta dinner to prep for the Fools Five Race. I couldn't be there, but I told them this was their space, and they joyfully accepted that. That kind of community-building and ethos is something that is not easily taught. In fact, as a former youth & family ministry teacher used to say- "it's caught more than it is taught."

Being able to rent this house is such a gift for recapturing the essence of who we are and is going to help tremendously in transitioning to our own building next fall. The students will already understand the culture of the LCC and will be able to claim the space as more than "just a building." It will, once again, become a member in our community, fostering the message we love to share- that all are welcome and all are beloved of God.

Thank you, dear Central. Thank you.

Habitat for Humanity Serving Winona County

The Habitat For Humanity fundraiser- Wild Wild West House-Raising Hootenanny is coming soon. On Thursday, June 11 the fun will begin at 5:30 and include Backwater BBQ, live music, games and silent and live auctions. This all takes place at the Minnesota Equestrian Center. Tickets are available at the Habitat for Humanity Winona County website.

This fundraiser hopes to raise \$100,00 to continue the work of Habitat in providing safe and affordable housing for adults and children. Habit has been busy:

- St Charles twin home build is complete and families are moving in
- Repair home program continues to help families create homes that are accessible, safe and ready to meet changing health needs
- 1050 E. 9th St.house will be completed this fall (Central worked on the foundation for this house)
- Hilbert St. twin home project- 2 owner-occupied homes on a single lot, expanding access to affordable housing and using land efficiently - this project has involved zoning changes and local partnerships.

Central Lutheran continues to support Habitat for Humanity with our fundraiser sponsorship and participation in a summer work day (to be scheduled soon).

Winona Immigration Network Update

The Winona Immigration Network, the Winona Sheltering Network, and Richie Swanson sponsored a very successful Bird Walk fundraiser on May 16th. We raised money for a fund to help local immigrant families with urgent needs, some related to ICE detentions, some related to medical needs and some for opportunities for the children. The fund is available to local immigrants, even those who have not been directly assisted by WIN or WSN. It was a beautiful day and we had about 35 birders participate with three local bird experts. Thank you to all who attended.

On May 31st WIN and supporters had a potluck event at Faith Lutheran church. We visited, played games and ate a meal together. Everyone had a great time. We are planning to host a second annual salad luncheon in August. Those who attended last year enjoyed it so much they said we should make it an annual event. Plans for the menu and music are in the works. Watch for details in the August Newsletter and Central Currents.

Our families continue living life in spite of anxiety over changes in immigration policies and costs. All eight of the adults have full time jobs and six of the adults have passed the test for their driver's license!

Our WIN Committee will meet on June 1st and July 6th at 6:30 at Central. We would love to have you join us! We are always grateful for your prayers and support of this ministry.

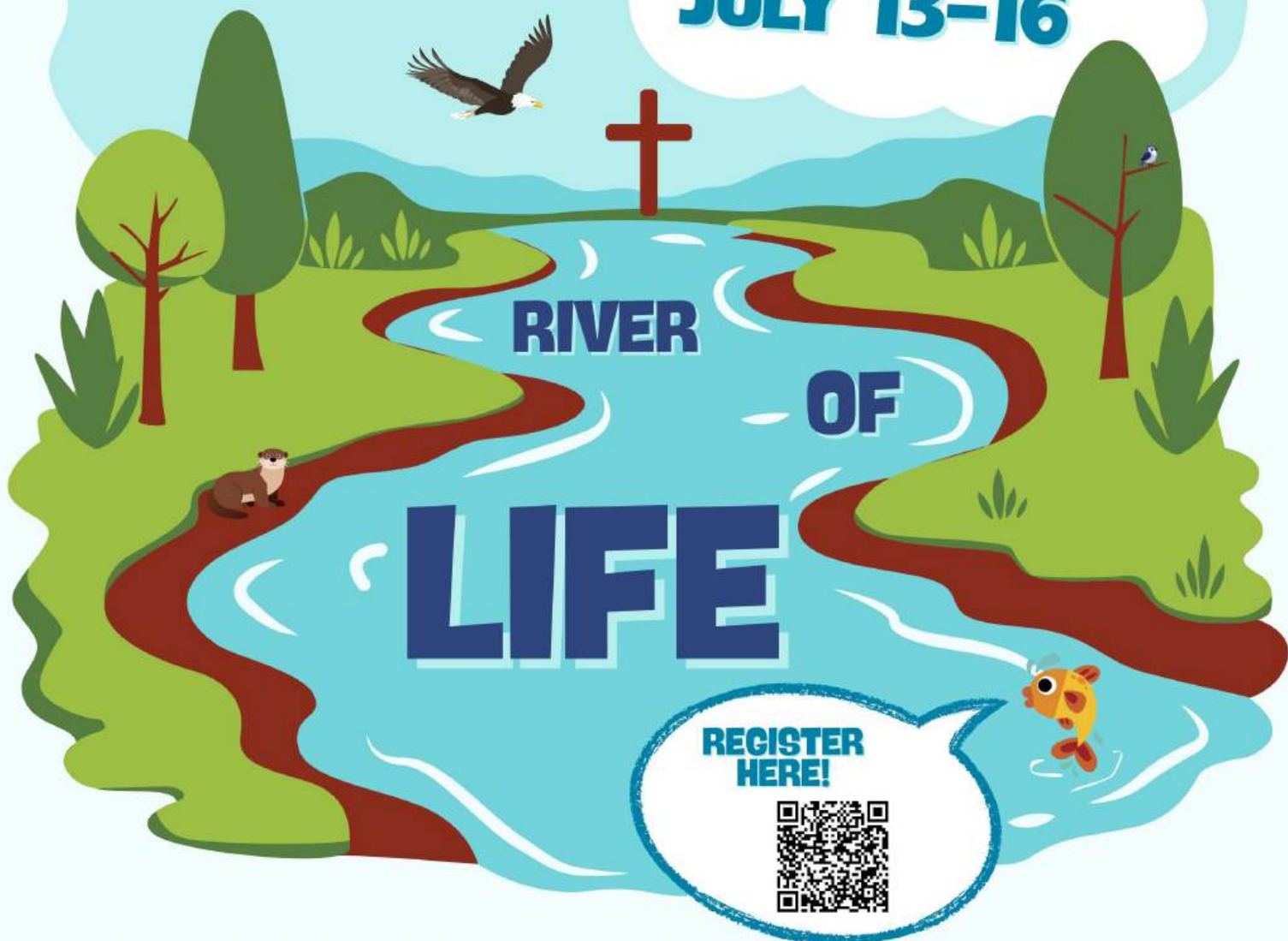
