# A MESSAGE FROM OUR DIRECTING PASTOR

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We are in my favorite time of the year as the weather cools down, the trees turn yellow and red, we become witnesses to the beauty of God's creation. This year has been enhanced a couple weeks ago with the specular show of the northern lights. We continue to be blessed by the beauty of the world we live in.

This time of year also reminds me of the busyness which life brings to us as well. Growing up in a rural part of the county, working with farmers and in our large family garden there was always work to be done before the cold of winter set in. On the farm it was getting in the crops and hauling grain to the elevators. There were barns and sheds to winterize to keep the stores of supplies, of hay and feed to stock pile. At home there was the freezing and canning of the vegetables and produce so it could supply us with food until the summer arrived and the spring crops matured.

This time also reminds me to be thankful. The first is to be thankful for all the blessing of the harvest which helped sustain us in life. The second was to be thankful for the many hands coming together to make quick or at least lessen the burden of all the work that was to be done. My parents could not have accomplished all the harvest of the fruits and vegetables without my brothers and sisters and I working alongside them. While we often complained about the work, we also enjoyed the fruits of our labors in the middle of winter with corn which tasted fresh off the cob or the chunky applesauce we ate all winter long. It was our working together that made the difference in helping to feed a growing family of seven.

These are the images which come to mind as I reach this point in the year. This is especially true I begin to prepare for a new year by looking back at where we are in this current year. The first thing I want to do is to give thanks to each of you for the work and support and energy you have given to Central. We could not and cannot accomplish our mission without your hands and feet joining with others in sharing the burden of making ministry happen in this space. There is not enough space for me to list all the accomplishments, the harvest of ministry work completed this year. So THANK YOU!

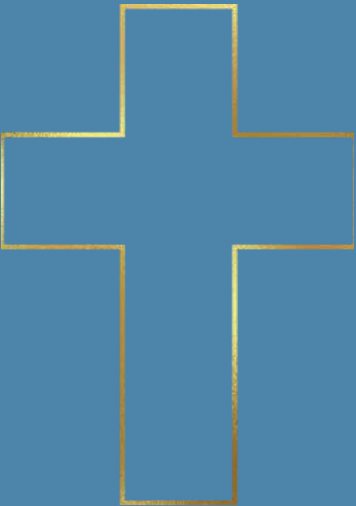

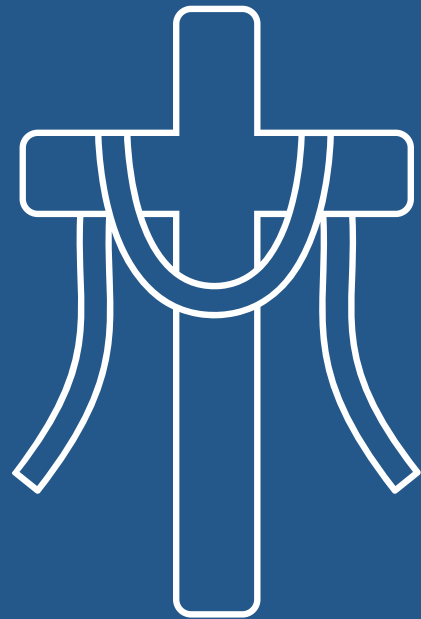

It continues to be my honor, privilege, and joy to serve this amazing congregation.

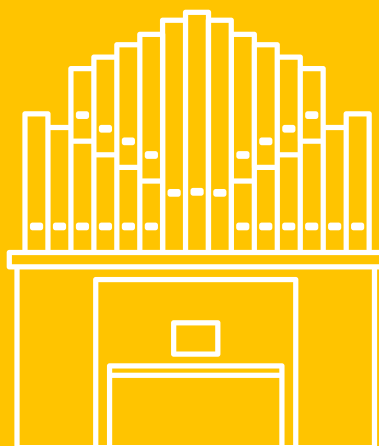
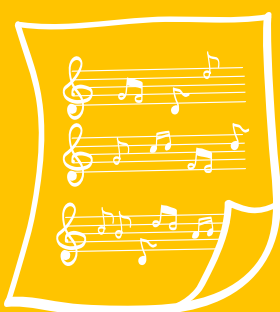

# WIN UPDATES

---

Thank you to congregational members, and friends of WIN in the Winona area, for attending, “A Taste of Latin America”, to raise funds for our families from Colombia and Nicaragua. Your support, and that of partnering congregations, has made this ministry possible and we are very grateful! WIN is currently assisting six adults and four children, ages 2, 9, 11 and 13 from Colombia, and two adults from Nicaragua. After a long wait, Alex and Veronica recently received their Social Security numbers and Employment Authorization Cards. We know you share their joy! They went right to work at Fanatics where Julio and Jazmina are also working. Edelber works at Behrens Manufacturing.

Now that school has started, three of the children are back in their classrooms. Carlos Thomas and Jeronimo are attending Winona Middle School. Dylan Mathias attends the Spanish Immersion Program at Jefferson. We have worked with Project Fine, Ready Set School and the Winona School District in finding ways to assist them as they continue their education and become accustomed to school in the United States.

Alex, Veronica, and their son Jeronimo have found a house to rent. The house they have been living in will no longer be available after the 1st of this year. They will be moving in mid-November. They are in need of room size rugs for the hardwood floors. If anyone knows of any large rugs that still have some wear left in them, please let Pastor Short, Denise or Judy know.
