A MESSAGE FROM OUR DIRECTING PASTOR

Sisters and Brothers,

In the last few weeks I have been reminded how life is filled with transitions. The world around us is transitioning towards winter. The nation is transitioning to a new administration after the election. The church is transitioning to a new year with the start of the season of Advent. While these are global transitions which just take place each year or each cycle. Other transitions just happen some planned, others unplanned. I am part of the LCC board which is transitioning to a new way of ministry after the fire in the building a couple months ago. There are members who are going through transitions within their lives after the birth of a child or the death of a loved one. Transitions come, yet not all transitions are bad, but all bring change. Which reminds me of that old saying: 'the only constant in life is change.'

While we may not have much control over when or if transitions happen, we do have some control as to how we respond. When transitions happen like the arrival of winter there things we can do in response. Some people dread its arrival and prepare to hibernate for a few months while others flee to warmer climates, and still others embrace it with gusto, these are transitions we can prepare for. While others like a fire which destroys a building or the death of a loved one are transitions we cannot really prepare for ahead of time. As a result, it is our response which makes a difference not only in our lives but in the lives of others around us.

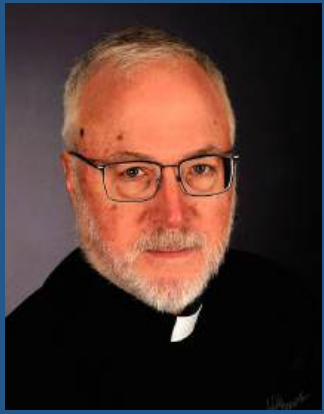
Often when unexpected transitions are forced upon us our natural reaction is to move into our emotion of grief. Grief comes in many forms: anger, depression, or confusion before we are able to move into acceptance or action. One example was after the fire at the LCC building many of the students gathered outside the building the following Sunday. There they had prayers, they shared their feelings, they expressed their grief over the loss of the building a place they called home. Finally, they broke bread together. The following weeks for them have been one of trying to find a new sense of welcome, a new place of comfort, a place where they feel at home on campus. Yet it was their example of gathering, of being centered in prayer and in the breaking of bread, grounding themselves in their faith, in their trust that Christ was in their midst has helped to sustain them during this time of transition.

Like the old saying goes: 'the only constant in life is change' yet I would like to add a second constant or maybe a greater constant in life, that is Jesus our Savior. Our faith offers us that assurance. Jesus himself makes that promise at the end of the Gospel of Matthew as he sends the disciples and us out with a mission to take the Good News to all nations saying: 'Remember I am with you always to the end of the age.'

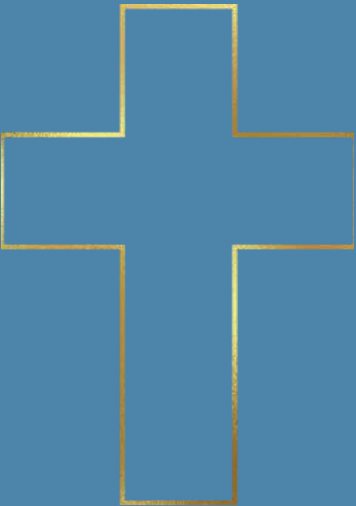
So when transitions take place around you. When you feel lost or angry or confused, just know you are not alone. For these were the emotions or feelings of the people in ancient times as they awaited the arrival of the Messiah. There were the feelings in the Roman Empire at the time when Caesar Augustus was ruling and he declared the whole world was to be registered. It was this transition which set in motion the fulfillment of what the prophets of old had declared that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem whose name would be Immanuel which means 'God with us.'

Please come join us Advent season as we wait during this time of transition for the arrival of Jesus our Savior. Then come on Christmas Eve to hear the angels proclaim: 'unto you is born this day in the City of David, a Savior, the Messiah, the Lord.'

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Last week I was taken aback when I started talking to a member about advent, specifically advent fair because, at the time of writing this, it was a week away! I thought to myself, “Where did November go? Wasn’t it just November 2nd last week?” Between prepping for advent, weekly confirmation, sermons, trying to always put my family first and all the meetings, November somehow flew by. As I reflected on just exactly where the time went, later that day, I started to feel like things are continually moving at a faster and faster speed. And even though I’ve been told it just gets worse the older and older we get, I can’t help but wonder how to make it, time, slow down.

I know that at one point or another, we have all been guilty of giving into the crazy speed of life these days by overplanning, overcommitting, or overexerting ourselves. I’m sure some of you have probably even had the same thought of “If I just get through this (busy time or busy weekend) next week or month won’t be so bad”. We will come together in Grace Hall to lean into this season, fellowship, eat together, be present with each other and listen to a short message/devotional as we prepare for the coming of the Savior. 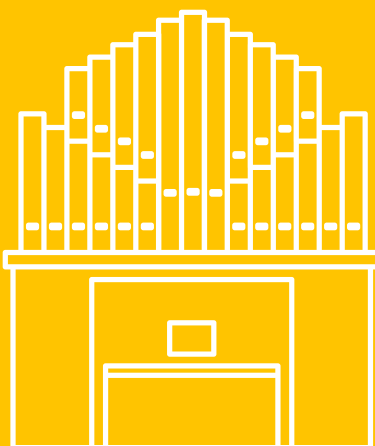
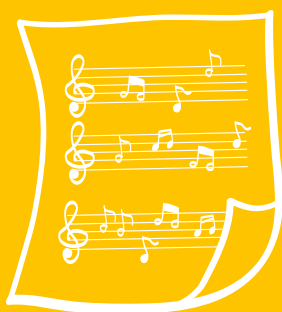

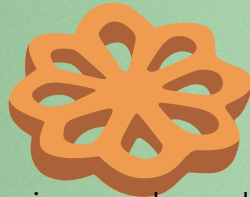
WELCA Christmas Bake Sale and Lunch-Saturday, December 14th

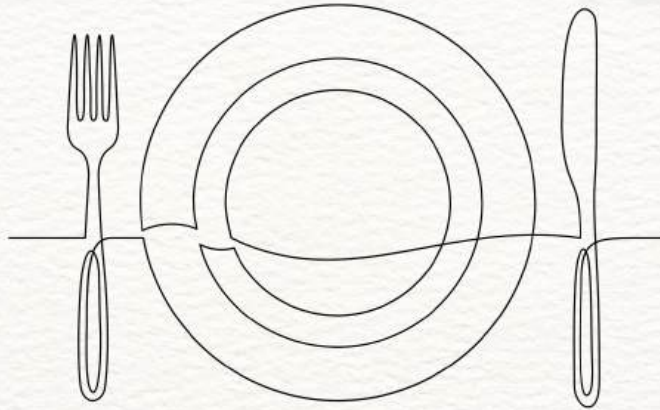
