Sisters and Brothers in Christ

I went to see my eye doctor a few weeks ago. It was needed because I was struggling to be able to read everything I needed to each week. It became evident when I realized I needed to make the font on my computer bigger and bigger to be able to read it clearly. What also prompted my eye doctor's appointment came in two different ways. The first was when we were traveling and I had to really focus to be able to read the signs to be sure I was able to get to the places we were going on vacation. While we were going to familiar places and I can often get there without much guidance from the GPS, I realized it took me a little longer to clearly see the signs which pointed me to the places we were heading. In the same way, I found myself relying a little more on the voice telling me 'turn left ahead'.

The second and even bigger indicator was playing golf. I struggle to see where my ball landed or where it was until I was almost to it. Often I would say after teeing off for the hole I needed to ask my playing partners 'did you see where it went?'. Or after hitting that approach shot to the green, my partners would get excited because the ball was heading toward the hole even as I stood there not sure if it was even on the green. So I decided if I was going to hit a good shot and maybe get it close to the hole, I wanted to see it for myself.

All this to become a reminder that there are times in our lives we need others in our lives, to see what we are unable to see for ourselves. To remind us of where we are in life keeping us on the path, guiding us to turn left or right to get us to our destination. Otherwise we could find ourselves on the wrong path, head in the opposite direction or not see or appreciate that which is most important in life. This is not only true in our life in the world but in our faith life as well.

This past school year during confirmation class, Pr Kristen and the guides have worked with the youth to teach them the scriptures, the books of the Bible and the stories of our ancestors in the faith. The greatest hope is the youth will come to recognize themselves in the journeys our ancestors took. More importantly they might see how God was at work leading and guiding them on their journey. That they would appreciate the gift we all have received in Jesus our Savior who came to show us and set an example for us in life. Lastly to hear the guidance of the Spirit reminding us 'left turn ahead'.

This being said, is as we prepare for the summer months, with the break we take from Sunday School and from some of the other activities within the church that people will forget they need someone to guide them in life and in faith. That during this summer break some will turn away from the light and forge ahead in the darkness, falsely believing they know the way to where they are going. Yet there is only one way, one truth, one light who shows us the way.

That you might listen to that voice guiding you saying 'right turn ahead then you have reached your destination.'

A MESSAGE FROM OUR ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters in Christ-

Gleam. It's the word I read on my to-do sticky note I had made the day before, after Sunday services, before writing this newsletter article. A quick reminder to me on Monday about something I knew I needed to accomplish that week. It means to shine brightly, especially with reflected light. I thought for a few minutes about why I would put gleam on my to-do list, until I realized that it was actually "g-learn", a mandatory training for me, which I did not hyphenate, and wrote quickly. Still, on a day where it was cloudy and I was feeling busyness of ministry, I couldn't think of a better reminder for me, and for us.

Not only is gleaming shining brightly, but it's main definition comes from shining off of reflected light. When I thought about my misinterpretation of my quick reminder to myself, I laughed at how on point it was with how I felt that day, a little lackluster, coming back from seeing friends and colleagues at a preaching conference. I simply was lacking that shine when I read that word, and it was a great reminder to me about what God calls us to do in our lives.

We, as Christians, are called to let God's light, through Jesus, shine through us. We are called to be the light in the darkness, as Jesus is the light in the darkness to us. More specifically, we are called to *reflect* that light, to gleam God's love. And this particular day, the day when the weight of hustling, when the weight of figuring out all the details for the many youth and family activities this summer, reminded me that it's not just about doing. It's about gleaming.

We gleam, we minister, we love for others. When our youth go up to Duluth on a mission trip in less than a month, they are there to gleam- to reflect God's light to those in that community who need. When our high schoolers head to New Orleans in July, they are there to receive the love and light and gleam it not only to the city of New Orleans, but to each other. Our National Youth Gathering students will learn and see what happens when thousands of Lutheran high schoolers get together and gleam God's love to each other. It's through these two trips that our youth will have an opportunity to them gleam the light to this community in Winona, their community in their neighborhoods and schools and in our church.

Our younger students will have a whole week this summer to learn and receive God's love and gleam it onto their family and friends during our vacation Bible school day camp. As they sing songs, play games and lean into God's love, they will radiate that light, gleaming for others.

We have a jam-packed summer for Children, Youth and Family, with many opportunities to serve and walk alongside our students. I pray that we as a church can *gleam* for our children and youth through these. Thank you to all who have helped our ministry this year. We are looking for volunteers to help chaperone and cook lunch at day camp, and are still shy of our fundraising efforts for our two youth trips. If you feel called to gleam, to spread God's love and light for the world, onto our youngest church members with your time, talents, prays or treasures, please reach out to me! 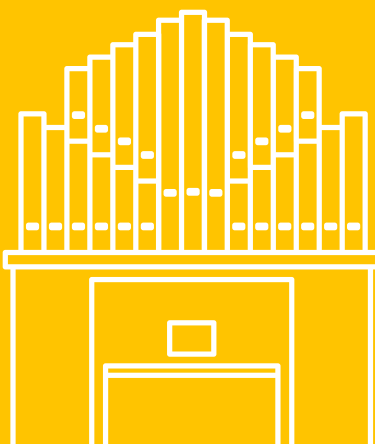
