

A Message from our Worship, Music & Arts Director

It is my intention to invite community players to join our members. Some preliminary conversations I've had with other churches would indicate there is interest in making this happen.

Along with the return of Central's bells, we will be hosting a collaborative concert with the Rochester Area Handbell Choir in May. The


group's conductor and I have already met to discuss details. Several members of our congregation will be joining me to perform with this outstanding group. I will share more details about the event soon.

I am incredibly grateful for all the opportunities we have to praise the Lord! Blessings, always.



Sondheim on Sondheim at the Page Theatre, Saint Mary's University, Sat. March 18, 2023, 2:30 PM

Sondheim on Sondheim is a musical revue consisting of music and lyrics written by the legendary composter Stephen Sondheim for his many shows. Sondheim passed away in November 2021 at the age of 91. The revue was conceived and directed by Sondheim's long-time collaborator James Lapine. The revue had a limited run on Broadway in 2010.

The songs, including well-known, less-known and cut material, are from nineteen Sondheim shows (including student shows) produced over a 62-year period, including several songs each from West Side Story, Company, Follies, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Sunday in the Park with George, Merrily We Roll Along, Passion, and Into the Woods.

Lapine describes the revue as "a collage of Sondheim's life, in which who he is and how he got there comes in to focus."

The show will mark the final chapter of director Judy Myers' long and successful career as Professor of Theatre at Saint Mary's.

The performance is free and open to all. Central Lutheran will reserve a block of tickets in advance.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mark presented the following December 2022 Financial Report:

December 2022 was over budget in donations and expenses. Income was budgeted at \$87,361 while \$91,002 was received. Expenses were budgeted at \$53,037 while actuals were \$64,871. The actual Income of \$91,002 over expenses of \$64,871 gave the month a gain of \$26,131.

Year to date income is \$893,645 less year to date expenses of \$631,150 gives a total of \$262,495 in revenue through year end, giving the year a very good income to expenses ratio and starts next year on a continued good footing with previous years gains.

Extra expenses were Garage Electric service and outlets were put in for \$1,364 and snowplowing was \$1,876.

Child Care Fund:

The Child Care Fund had income of \$62,418 less expenses of \$78,206 giving it a monthly loss of (\$15,788). The YTD gain is still positive at \$28,594.
