## A Message from our Directing Pastor

The fall events and activities are in full swing. The FEAST had a great first meal. The Sunday school program began with a fun-filled Rally day. Confirmation programs have started for our 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders on Wednesday nights as well as the final preparation for our 9<sup>th</sup> grade youth to be confirmed at the end of Oct.

One of the things I reminded the 9<sup>th</sup> grade youth as they prepare to affirm their baptism is on that day they become adult members of the congregation. As such they should find an opportunity to become involved in the life and ministry of Central as they live out their faith in life. This not only goes for them but for all of us as members of the body of Christ.

Within the next few weeks we will be sending out a Time and Talent commitment form. This will allow them and each of us to consider how we might offer our gifts for the ministry of the church. There are many opportunities on Sunday mornings to offer our hands and energy in support of the ministries of Central. In addition, there are Committees, book groups, quilters, Bible studies and confirmation guides which give you additional ways to serve. Please fill out and return the Time and Talent commitment form when it arrives.

Additionally, we are working on the budget of the church so the ministries which make up who we are as this body of Christ in this place might succeed. In order to do so, this will take your financial commitment in addition to your time. One thing we are aware of is the need for both to make ministry work. Some have more time than resources. Others have more resources than time or have a limited ability to serve. All we ask of you is to consider how God is calling you to support the ministries of the church with the abundance you have already received.

Central as a whole is doing the same. We continue to look at our resources and how they are being used to further the kingdom of God in this place. We do so by opening our doors to community events. This not only offers the community a place to gather to enjoy great music or to gather for a special event, it introduces them to who we are. See Eric's article on the events coming in Oct, Nov and Dec. By opening our doors to such events, we are able to serve the community beyond what we do on Sunday mornings or Wednesday nights.

One of the ways we have reached beyond our walls is the group called WIN (the Winona Immigration Network) welcomed Edleber into our community. We continue to work with Project Fine and other groups in town to welcome other immigrants just as our ancestors were welcomed in the past. A result of this work, we have been invited to host Bishop Ata, who is the bishop of the Lutheran Church in Columbia on Nov. 5<sup>th</sup>. That day we will acknowledge and celebrate our continuing work of living out our faith by welcoming those in need, the immigrants to our town or the hungry to the FEAST or the homeless in our work with Habitat. In doing so we live out our faith as Jesus encouraged us when he reminded the people to care for the widow, the orphan and the alien in the land.

Most of all I want to say thank you. In the years since my arrival, Central has been blessed by your support of the ministries. We have been lifted up by your gifts of RMD from your IRAs, bequests as members remembered Central in your wills, gifts of stock but most of all by your generosity in your weekly offerings. So I give thanks to God for each of you and for all you do to make Central the place where ministry happens and the love of God is lived out here in Winona.


## A Message from our Associate Pastor




