A Message from our Directing Pastor

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Here in this time of continual change we often seek that which is stable, usual, comfortable, ordinary. In general, I like changes, they force me to take stock of where I am and they force me to ask if what I was used to the best way to accomplish the task or to do the activity. Many times I can say that I will revert to the old ways and to return to the normal because it seems to be the best way forward. Then there are the times when a change will bring about a new way of looking at things, of doing things differently that is actually better or accomplishes the task in a way I would never have thought about.

Change is often more difficult when it comes to activities or organizations like churches. Our faith, the way in which we practice our faith, the practices of our churches are so mired in tradition that change is disrupting to the whole process. When changes like we have been forced to make come upon us, we feel lost and disconnected from our faith. Yet our faith has not changed, our God and what we believe has not changed, just the way in which it is practiced has changed.

I am thankful for the many ways you as members of Central have embrace some of the changes we have had to make over the last few months. Moving to online worship, then to in-person in our parking lot to worshipping around Winona in the parks. These changes have forced us to reconsider what is sacred to us in our life of faith. It is being in the physical structure of the building? It is being in community with other members? Is it following the same rituals within the worship that we have known and feel comfortable with?

With the arrival of the fall we once again long for the usual and a return to a 'normal' way of life. Yet we know that is not what is taking place. Masks are still mandatory, washing hands is still necessary, maintaining physical distance is required – all these things have not changed and have become even more necessary as we encounter more people from different parts of the country. These new practices will continue within the church as we seek to return to a more known schedule and practice at Central.

Confirmation classes will resume in-person but will have a virtual component included for those families not ready to resume in-person contact for health reasons. The beginning of Sunday School has been delayed until Oct 4th, as we prepare to educate our youth merging the old traditions with the new realities in life. Even when we return to worship in the sanctuary, the old familiar feeling will be there but will include many of the new normal behaviors we have become accustomed to. Aleah will be making the organ sing yet without the singing of the congregation. The liturgy will remain but done in a new and different way. We will return to the use of our screens and projectors to keep you informed and help lead you in worship. The old traditions will come back in new and different ways.

Two other changes which are coming have to do with staff changes. As most all of you are aware, Pr Louise is retiring and leaving her position as Visitation Pastor.

We give thanks for her dedicated service to Central and to her calling to serve and proclaim Jesus in this place. She and Jim are moving to Florida but hopefully we will see her again in the summer as they return north for a few weeks each year.

The other change is Dennis VanDrunen has given notice that he will retire after more than 30 years at Central at the end of October. In September we will be interviewing and looking for a replacement for him to care for the buildings and grounds of Central. Then in October we will find a way to celebrate his time of service with us.

Yet be sure of this, as changes continue to come, as new practices replace old traditions, there is one thing that never changes. Our God never changes. Jesus our Savior continues to be with us. The Spirit of God continues to call us together and sends us out to proclaim the changeless love God has for all of us.

Preparing for Holy Communion at Home

In September we will once again include the service of Holy Communion in our worship services, both in person and on line. So if you are at home and plan on participating in sharing communion with us, here are a couple suggestions to prepare a place for this holy meal.

Create a sacred space by laying out a napkin or placemat

Place a candle in that space and light it as the worship service begins

Prepare the meal by placing some bread and a small cup of wine on a place. You may use gluten free or a cracker in place of bread. Also grape juice in place of the wine.

Then as we share Holy Communion in worship, you may serve each other at home.

If you have small children who do not yet participate in the meal, don't forget to bless them at this time. Maybe even invite them to bless each other or to bless you as well. A blessing might be as simple as 'Jesus loves you' or whatever words you might want to use.



The Center's Team


The Center continues to operate at with strict guidelines adhered to by the State of MN, CDC and Winona Covid-19 Response Team.

NEWS FROM YAGM SENEGAL

A Missionary In the United States

Like many of you, I did not expect COVID to have such a lengthy impact on our lives in the United States. When I left Senegal in late March, I expected to return in a few months. But, it's now August, and I am still in the United States. As are many other ELCA missionaries.

I want to share with you what that means for me as and ELCA missionary.

Due to COVID-19, the 2020-2021 Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) year will be a Jubilee year. We will not host YAGM in our companion countries, but we will continue with ministry. YAGM Country Coordinators, including myself, will focus on a YAGM program evaluation, YAGM specific continuing education, and relationships with our companions.

The YAGM Country Coordinators will also be sharing stories from YAGM alumni and YAGM companions, as well as working to create a program that more intentionally embodies the values of the Kingdom of God, especially in the areas of anti-racism and gender justice. In July

we began by hosting an Anti-Racist Book Study via social media and zoom.

Council Report: July 21, 2020

PRESENT: Pastor Short, Scott Mlynczak, Chris Nisbit, Bill Davis, Marie Holmquist, Tammy Swenson Lepper, Paul Ness, Myrna Olson

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. Marie opened with devotions.

Bill moved, Paul seconded, carried to approve the agenda.

Tammy moved, Bill seconded, carried to approve the June 16, 2020, minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Paul gave the following Treasurer's report:

June offerings were \$28,242 compared to a budget of \$30,871 which is a negative variance of (\$2,629) with a year to date negative variance of (\$37,618). Investment gains and losses turned positive in May and June by \$1,724 and \$3,568 respectively. The four month start to the year was a loss of (\$13,152) to a net loss year to date of (\$7,859).

June expenditures were \$46,199 compared to a budget of \$47,699 which is a positive \$1,500. Year to date expenditures has a negative variance of (\$16,636). Large expenditures during that time were for repairs of the elevator and water main. The Child Care Center has incurred expenditures over revenue for the last six months of (\$38,360) which is within the PPP loan forgiveness.

Bill moved, Chris seconded, carried to approve the Treasurer's Report.

OLD BUSINESS

House that God Built - The cost for the sound and video camera system in the sanctuary is \$17,141.28. To date, \$13,850 has been received with \$3,291.28 funding yet needed to complete the project.

Organ Repairs – On hold.

Update on parking lot lease – Pastor has met with Winona State University regarding switching parking lots for WSU's Gold Parking Lot. Winona State is in agreement and we are waiting for a new lease to be signed.

NEW BUSINESS

Reopening to outside groups

The Red Cross will be holding a blood drive in Grace Hall on Thursday, July 23. They will do all the sanitizing of the area. The City of Winona has requested the use of Grace Hall for primary election day use and their rules fulfill CLC's policy. Following further discussion, it was decided not to allow use of the church by outside groups at this time. Marie moved, Tammy seconded, carried to allow the primary election use in August.

150th Anniversary Celebration Planning – Our church will be celebrating its 150th anniversary on September 26, 2021. A committee has been formed to plan for the event. The congregation will be contacted for additional ideas and suggestions.

Upcoming staffing changes –

Pastor Louise will be retiring at the end of August. Pastor Linda will help as needed.

Dennis Van Drunen will be retiring October 31. An updated job description has been created to use in hiring a new person. Following discussion and review of the proposed job description, Paul moved, Bill seconded, carried to approve the job description with addendums.

Stewardship planning – Discussion was held regarding stewardship planning.

STAFF REPORTS

- Staff reports were reviewed
- Pastor Short reported there have been meetings regarding Sunday School and no decisions have been made yet.
- Kelly submitted a report covering the first four months into the COVID-19 Pandemic for the Child Care Center
- The Center has hired a temporary part-time custodian who will clean the Center, this is a temporary 90 day position that will be re-evaluated at that time.
- Kelly reported that a new Central Parking Permit system has been created this year. A process has been developed to assist the team on the steps of parking permits.
- The Church continues to assess Central's COVID-19 Preparedness Plan for re-opening worship.
- Aleah reported that she and Pastor Short have determined they will continue to offer weekly outdoor Sunday morning services as well as a recorded online service.
- Confirmation students have been invited to serve as acolyte/ushers.
- Aleah has secured shelter rentals and/or green space for all Sundays in August to hold church outside. This is an excellent opportunity for the church to *Be Central to Winona*
- John and Pastor will be meeting with high school students to see what programs they'd be interested in and to continue building relationships.
- No decisions have been made for Confirmation/Wednesday Night Workshop yet. John is looking for volunteers to be Confirmation guides.
- Planning for Confirmation Sunday in the fall.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

The Feast is supporting the Catholic Worker House in providing a hot meal daily to 20 to 40 people that request it. The Feast covers the fourth Tuesday of every month.

Property Committee Winona Nursery will be replacing some of the plants that did not do well over the winter.

Paul moved, Bill seconded, carried to approve the staff and committee reports.

The next meeting will be August 18, 2020, at 6:30 pm
